#### **MINUTES**

On this the 9<sup>th</sup> of January, 2012 the Commissioners Court of Jack County, Texas met in Regular session at 10:00 am with the following elected officials present:

James A. Logan, Commissioner Pct. #1 James L Brock, Commissioner Pct. #2 James L. Cozart, Commissioner Pct #3 Terry Ward, Commissioner Pct #4 Mitchell G. Davenport, County Judge

### **PUBLIC FORUM**

Alinda Cox informed the Court that references were being checked and an offer was being made to an applicant to the Extension Agent position.

#### PRESENTATION BY JACK COUNTY 4-H

Alinda Cox and several members of the 4 - H spoke about their projects that were entered into the Jack County Livestock Show, and the opportunities and positive things they learn from being in 4 - H.

#### DISTRICT CLERK RECORDS

District Clerk, Tracie Pippin, and two representatives from IDocket spoke about the positive benefits from digitizing the District Clerk Records and placing them on the Internet. Commissioner Cozart moved to accept the proposal at no cost to the County. Commissioner Ward seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

### **LUTHER PRUNTY LANE**

Commissioner Logan moved to name the private lane to Mr. Luther Prunty's homeplace "Luther Prunty Lane." Judge Davenport seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

# NORTEX PRESENTATION ON RAWS UNIT GRANT

Dennis Wilde and Mike Bland from Nortex spoke about a Grant available to Jack County to purchase the MOBILE RAWS UNIT. The county commissioners could accept the Grant and do a permanent loan to the Jack County Rural Fire Department with the Department having the responsibility for the location, maintenance, and upkeep of the unit.

### JCRFD PRESENTATION ON RAWS UNIT

Jeff Jackson of the Jack County Rural Fire Department spoke of the benefits of the RAWS UNIT in fighting fires in Jack County. The information from the unit being in our area would be much more accurate than information from the units in other counties where the weather may be different than local weather.

# HOMELAND SECURITY 2011 GRANT

Commissioner Cozart made a motion to accept the grant and execute a Memorandum of Understanding to permanently loan the RAWS unit to the JCRFD. Commissioner Brock seconded the motion and the motion carried by a vote of 4-1.

# SQUAW MOUNTAIN ROAD BRIDGE

Judge Davenport spoke about the bridge to be moved. He made an offer to the land owner in writing with no response. He just wanted to update the Court on the status.

### DAVIS BUILDING ROOF REPLACEMENT

Deputy Mayo informed the court the estimate for materials to replace the roof is \$6,000. He said the Sheriff recommended that the roof be replaced by early Spring. Motion was made by Commissioner Cozart to replace the roof. Commissioner Logan seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

## PUBLIC FORUM

Joe Wilkerson from Ironmarket clarified his earlier proposal for sale of heavy equipment for the Precincts. The item will be placed on a future agenda for a vote on the proposition FILED FOR RECORD
