



PUBLIC FORUM

Sheriff Mayo spoke to the Court regarding options for hiring a custodian for the Courthouse. He will run an ad in the Jacksboro Newspaper and continue taking applications.

PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND CLAIMS

All accounts and claims were submitted to the Court for approval. Those submitted were approved and entered into the computer of the County Treasurer on motion of Commissioner Logan and seconded by Commissioner Cozart. The motion carried unanimously.

UPDATE ON COURTHOUSE REPAIR PROJECT 2011

Judge Davenport received the insurance claim check and settlement agreement from Gulf Coast Claims Service. Once a written warranty is received from Firestone regarding their guarantee of the application of their material to the Courthouse roof, Judge Davenport will execute the agreement and check.

COURTHOUSE LAWN, SPRINKLER, AND LANDSCAPING

Consideration of steps, measures, and a plan for restoration/renovation of the Courthouse lawn, sprinkler system, and landscaping were discussed. The sprinkler system should run on a separate water meter that needs to be installed by the City of Jacksboro at a cost of \$2,300.

Motion was made by Commissioner Logan to publish bid specifications for this project in the local newspaper and have the city install a new water meter. Commissioner Ward seconded and the motion carried.

CONSOLIDATE VOTING PRECINCTS

Consider action to consolidate Voting Precincts 1, 3, 4, and 6 for the joint political party runoff election for July 31, 2012; voting for same Voting Precinct to be conducted in the regular Voting Precinct 6 polling place in the Courthouse Assembly Room;

Motion to approve was made by Commissioner Logan and seconded by Commissioner Cozart. Motion carried unanimously.

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
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

As a result of the May 29, 2012 Primary Election it will be necessary to have a State Run-off Election on July 31, 2012.



PLAN CHANGE SUMMARIZED:

1. Current Location of Voting Box Nos. 1, 3, 4, and 6: Jack County presently uses a 7 voting box plan. Four of them are all located with the city of Jacksboro. One is located in the town of Bryson, one is located in the community of Perrin, and the Early Voting Box is also located in Jacksboro and serves all voting precincts in the county [see maps attached].

The Democratic and Republican Parties both use these boxes as part of their voting plan and in May they conducted by agreement a joint primary for state, district, and county offices. The voter turnout was relatively light.

A runoff election is scheduled by both parties for July 31. Voter turnout for such an election is traditionally lighter than the primary.

2. Consolidation of County Voting Sites: The entity will temporarily relocate its polling place for Voting Boxes 1, 3, and 4 for the July 31, 2012 election to the same location as that for Voting Precinct 6: Assembly Room, Room 104, Jack County Courthouse, 100 N. Main St., Jacksboro.

There is adequate space here to house and operate the voting equipment. Adequate tables and chairs will be provided. The space is handicap accessible.

Such a move will not unduly inconvenience the voters of these precincts and the measure will be taken at a considerable savings to the parties and the County.

ENACTMENT OF CHANGE:

The Commissioners Court of Jack County, Texas duly enacted in public session an order providing for the proposed revisions in the Jack County Voting Plan. Said order is a part of the Court's minutes of its meeting date of December 28, 2009 (see copy attached).

STATUTORY AUTHORITY FOR CHANGE:

Sections 43.002, 43.003, and 43.031 of the Texas Election Code provides the statutory basis for the relocation (see copy attached).

EFFECTIVE DATE OF CHANGE:

July 8, 2012.

ANTICIPATED EFFECT OF THE CHANGE ON MEMBERS OF RACIAL OR LANGUAGE MINORITY GROUPS:

None.

PAST OR PENDING LITIGATION CONCERNING THE CHANGE:

None.

DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION:

PRIOR PRECLEARANCE:

Jack County requests that any prior preclearance measures be expedited to allow more than ample time to implement the changes prior to the effective date. The change is minimal, however, in its scope and impact.

PUBLICITY AND PARTICIPATION:

Attached as exhibits are documents evidencing public notice of the proposed change soliciting public comment from interested parties and input in making the decision including, but not limited to, copies of the meetings agendas, newspaper articles, and public minutes of the meetings in which consideration was given to the change.

The entity will endeavor to inform the public of the change through newspaper articles in newspapers commonly read by voters in the area affected, by posted notices at the regular location on the July 31, 2012 Election Day, posting notice on the entity's internet website, and by public service announcements through the local radio station.

No person spoke in opposition to the temporary move at the public hearing.

EXPEDITED CONSIDERATION:

The entities request that this filing be given expedited consideration by the Department. Good cause for it exists in that if this joint plan is not approved great hardship will be worked on the entity and the voters of Jack County in that some other immediate plan or change will be required to hold the election.

ELECTION CODE
TITLE 4. TIME AND PLACE OF ELECTIONS
CHAPTER 43. POLLING PLACES
SUBCHAPTER A. NUMBER AND LOCATION OF POLLING PLACES
(2012)

§ 43.002. Designation of Location: General or Special Election Using County Precincts

(a) For a general or special election in which the use of county election precincts is required, the county clerk shall recommend the location of the polling place for each county election precinct, except as provided by Subsection (b). The commissioners court shall designate the recommended location as the polling place unless the court finds good cause to reject the recommendation. In that case, the commissioners court shall designate another location.

(b) If county election precincts are consolidated, the commissioners court shall designate the location of the polling place for the consolidated precinct.

(c) In making a designation under this section, the commissioners court of a county with a population of more than 175,000 may not designate a location as a polling place that would require a voter in the precinct to travel more than 25 miles from the voter's residence to the polling place.

§ 43.003. Designation of Location: Primary Election

The county chair of a political party holding a primary election shall designate the location of the polling place for each election precinct in the primary unless the precinct is one that is consolidated. In that case, the county executive committee shall designate the location.

§ 43.031. Polling Place in Public Building

(a) In this subchapter, "public building" means a building owned or controlled by the state or a political subdivision.

(b) Each polling place shall be located inside a building.

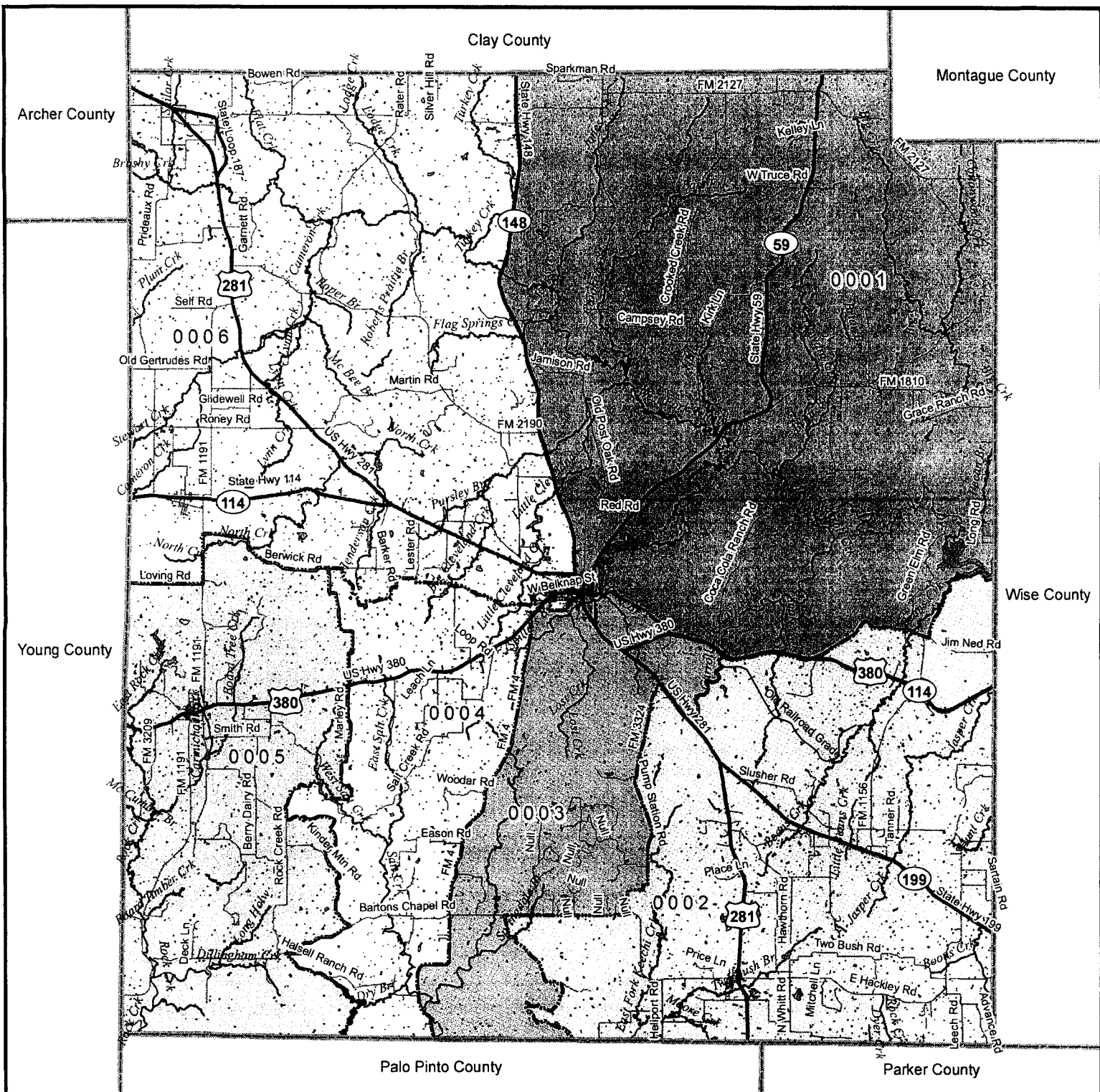
(c) The building selected for a polling place shall be a public building if practicable. The entity that owns or controls a public building shall make the building available for use as a polling place in any election that covers territory in which the building is located. If more than one authority requests the use of the building for the same day and simultaneous use is impracticable, the entity that owns or controls the building shall determine which authority may use the building.

(d) If a suitable public building is unavailable, the polling place may be located in some other building, including a building on a federal military base or facility with the permission of the post or base commander, and any charge for its use is an election expense. A polling place may not be located in a building under this subsection unless electioneering is permitted on the building's premises outside the prescribed limits within which electioneering is prohibited, except that a polling place may be located in a building at which electioneering is not permitted if it is the only building available for use as a polling place in the election precinct.

(e) A polling place may not be located at the residence of a person who is:

(1) a candidate for an elective office, including an office of a political party; or

(2) related within the third degree by consanguinity or the second degree by affinity, as determined under Chapter 573, Government Code, to a candidate described by Subdivision (1).

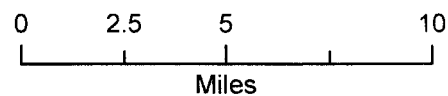


Voting Districts

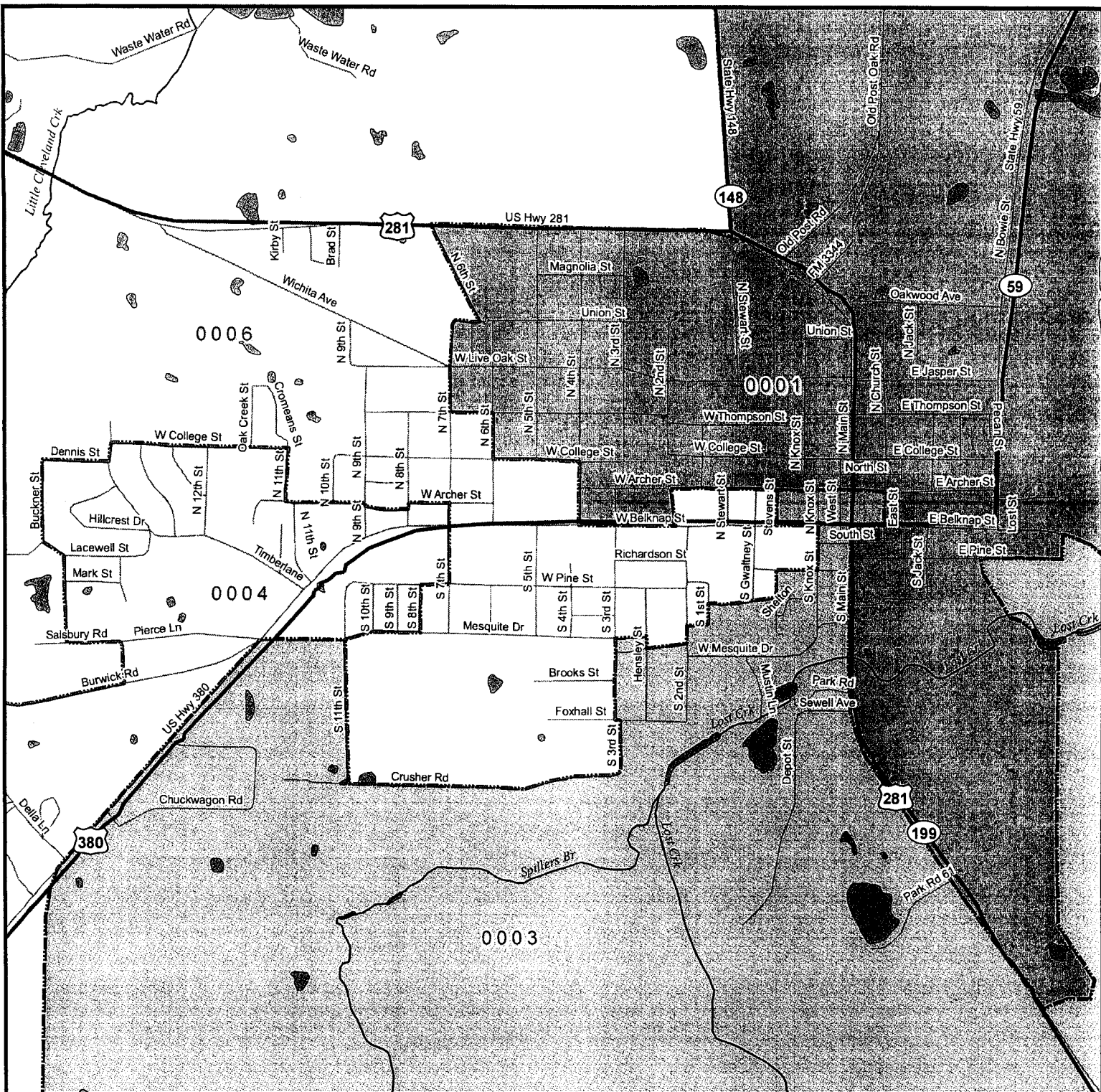

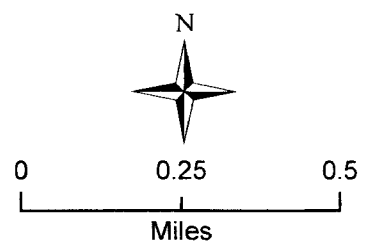

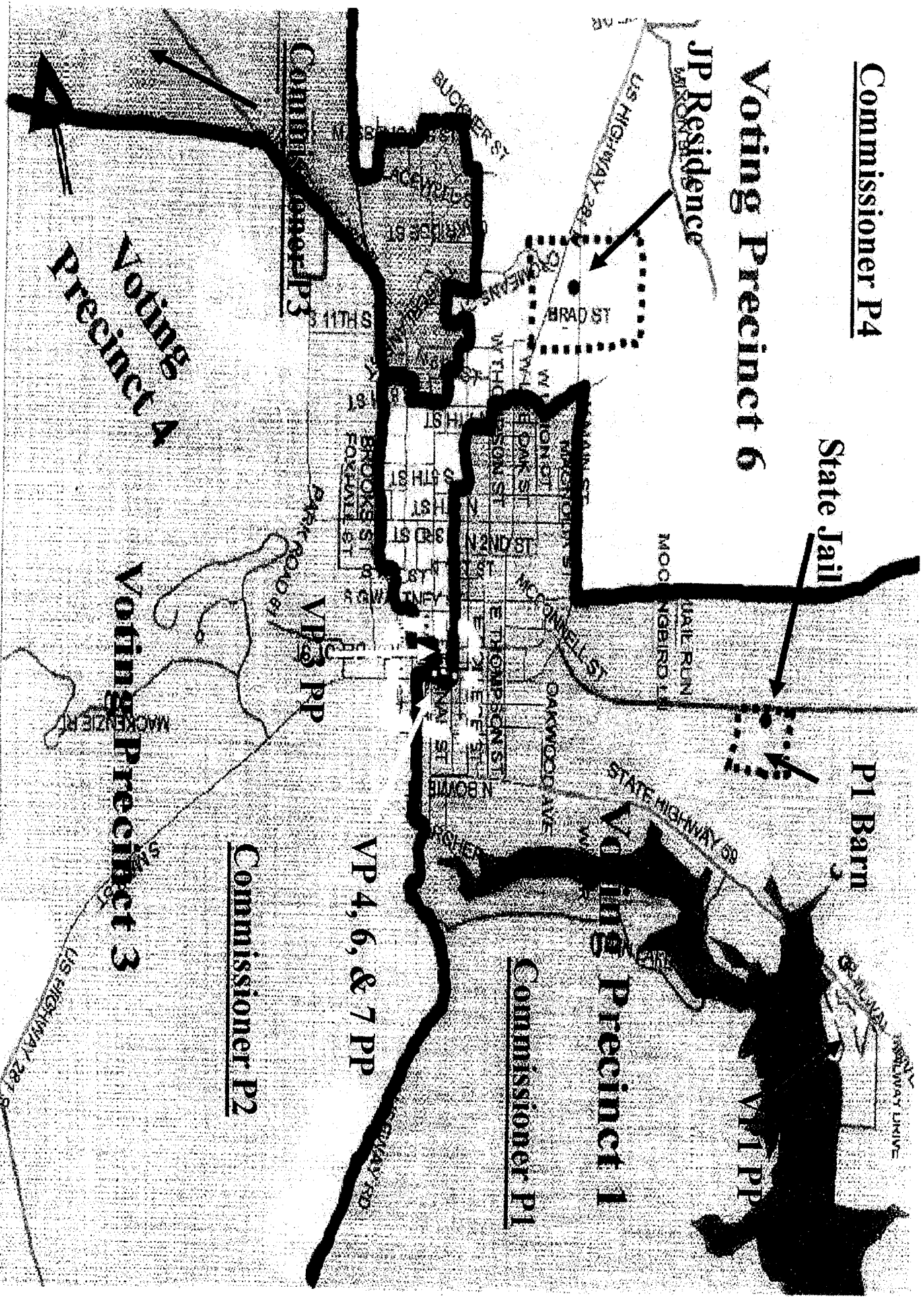

Marianne Myers was the only member of the general public present. She addressed the Court on the issue.



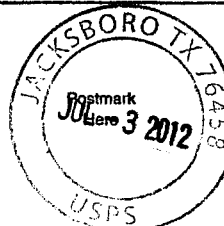

NOW COMES - Cobra O.I. Gas Corporation, hereinafter called Company, and respectfully makes this application to the Commissioners Court of Jack County, Texas, to grant unto the Company a permit for authorization to lay a pipeline or place a utility across and under the public roads of the County of Jack, State of Texas, conditioned as follows:

1. That said Company, in consideration for the grant by said County, does hereby agree that said pipeline/utility of the following description, crossing a county road in Precinct - 3, Jack County, Texas, at a point hereinafter indicated, will be constructed in such a manner that the construction of same will not interfere with public travel, and that no construction will begin until the Commissioner of said precinct, his agents, or employee approves said location by an on-site inspection.

DESCRIPTION AND LOCATION (Map must be attached):

2. The Company assures the County that it has obtained authorization, if any is required, from any landowners adjoining the crossing to cross whatever portion of their land, if any, lies beneath the roadway.

3. Such pipeline/utility shall be encased, so buried, covered, constructed and maintained as not to interfere with the use and occupancy of such roads by the public or the County. That a pipeline shall be buried to the depth of at least three (3) feet below the surface of the borrow ditch, that the pipeline/utility shall be situated no closer than three (3) feet from the edge of the roadway, and that the road will be restored at the time of construction to its original condition.

4. In the event it becomes necessary to build a Farm-to-Market Road or other road across such roads, it will become the duty of said the Company to adjust its pipeline with such construction without compensation from the County.

5. If said crossing is accomplished by crossing the traveled portion of said road, then the Company agrees it shall, that at its expense, bore under the road as its means of crossing and not cut or trench said road for a crossing.
