

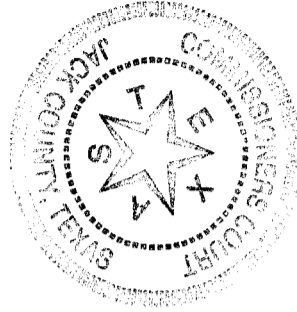

PUBLIC FORUM

No members of the public spoke.

PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND CLAIMS

All accounts and claims were submitted to the Court for approval. Those submitted were approved and entered into the computer of the County Treasurer. Commissioner Smith made a motion to pay all bills. Commissioner Brock seconded and the motion carried.

CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

Judge Davenport made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda items. Commissioner Ward seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

JACK COUNTY 4-H PRESENTATION

Alinda Cox, Jack County AgriLife Extension Agent brought 4-H kids Ashley Cox, Wesley Nebgen, and Hoyt Nebgen to give their presentations they made at the District 4-H Roundup. Hoyt Nebgen gave a presentation about ways to protect your skin and be safe in the sun when outdoors. Ashley Cox and Wesley Nebgen gave a presentation about Cyber Bullying.

PRECINCT OPERATIONS

Commissioner Brock placed 600 yards milled asphalt, obtained as surplus materials from TxDot, on Jim Ned Road in Precinct 2. A private company truck damaged a bridge in his precinct. The company contacted him and will repair the bridge to his specifications.

Commissioner Smith has concerns about the names of bridges in his precinct. Commissioner Cozart advised that the bridge name known by the County is different from how TxDot identifies them.

COURTHOUSE REPAIR PROJECT 2012 AND 2013

Danny Nash almost has the roof completed at the Davis Building. The Court needs to consider some window replacements for the Davis Building. He is also working on the roof at the Jack County Law Enforcement Center. Once these two jobs are complete he will resume where he left off at the Courthouse.

COURTHOUSE LAWN, SPRINKLER SYSTEM AND LANDSCAPING

Commissioner Cozart is going to try and make contact with Robbie at McAlister's Landscaping with regards to the Courthouse lawn.

COMMISSIONERS SWORN ANNUAL REPORT

Judge Davenport distributed these reports and reminded that they are due in June 2013.

PERRIN WHITT CISD SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

Sheriff Mayo has been contacted by the Perrin Whitt Consolidated Independent School District (PWCISD) with a proposal for acquiring one School Resource Officer from October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014. Sheriff Mayo advised that the school pays half of the salary and Jack County half which includes county fringe benefits. When the school resource officers are

not working at the school during summer breaks and holidays they work for the Sheriff's Office. Commissioner Cozart made a motion to approve this contract with Perrin Whitt CISD. Commissioner Brock seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

LETTER OF AGREEMENT WITH SENATE WIND, LLC

Judge Davenport request the Court consider and approve execution of a Letter of Agreement by County Judge with Senate Wind, LLC on Settlement of issue of road damages in construction of Senate Wind Project for \$14,800.00. Commissioner Cozart made a motion to accept this request and Commissioner Brock seconded. The motion carried unanimously.

PURCHASE OF NEW WINDOW BLINDS FOR COURTHOUSE

Judge Davenport presented the information he obtained from A&E Blind and Awning and Home Depot. The office of the County Attorney needs blinds immediately with the summer heat already here and the west sun heating his office in the afternoon. After discussion the Court would like Judge Davenport to get an estimate from Lowe's. Commissioner Ward made a motion to approve the amount estimated by Home Depot while checking with Lowe's for an equal or better price and purchasing from the store with the lowest price. Commissioner Cozart seconded and the motion carried unanimously. Estimate is attached.

JOB DESCRIPTION FOR COUNTY PRECINCT ROAD HAND

Adoption of a job description and form for Jack County Precinct Road Hand was discussed. Commissioner Ward made a motion to Table this item until it is reviewed further. Judge Davenport seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

DAVIS BUILDING ROOF

Consider an application of sealant for north portion of Davis Building roof and authorize sale of surplus county property with Renee Bates and Associates for May 22, 2013 or alternate chosen by Commissioners Court. Commissioners discussed dates for the auction that has been previously approved. Commissioner Ward made a motion to apply sealant to the Davis Building roof. Commissioner Cozart seconded and the motion carried with Commissioner Brock and Judge Davenport voting For and Commission Smith voting Against.

ADJOURN


There being no further business motion was made by Commissioner Cozart to adjourn and seconded by Commissioner Brock. The motion carried unanimously.

7. The Company shall pay, at the time of application, the sum of \$500.00 for each crossing unto the Treasurer of Jack County, Texas. In the event that the permit is not granted, the application fee will be returned.

8. Said access herein granted may be assigned by the Company without further grant or procedure but grantee shall be bound by the same conditions.

9. In the event that the Company abandons its line, the Company shall remove its line from the roadway and this grant is vacated.

10. The Company is responsible to present this application to the Commissioner of the Precinct involved and obtain his signature evidencing the fact that he has seen the application and discussed the location with the Company. The Company shall then present the Application with the appropriate check to the County Judge's Office to then make arrangements for placing the matter on the Commissioners Court Agenda for approval.

11. The Company shall call the County Commissioner 48 hours prior to starting the actual work.

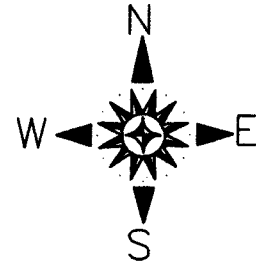
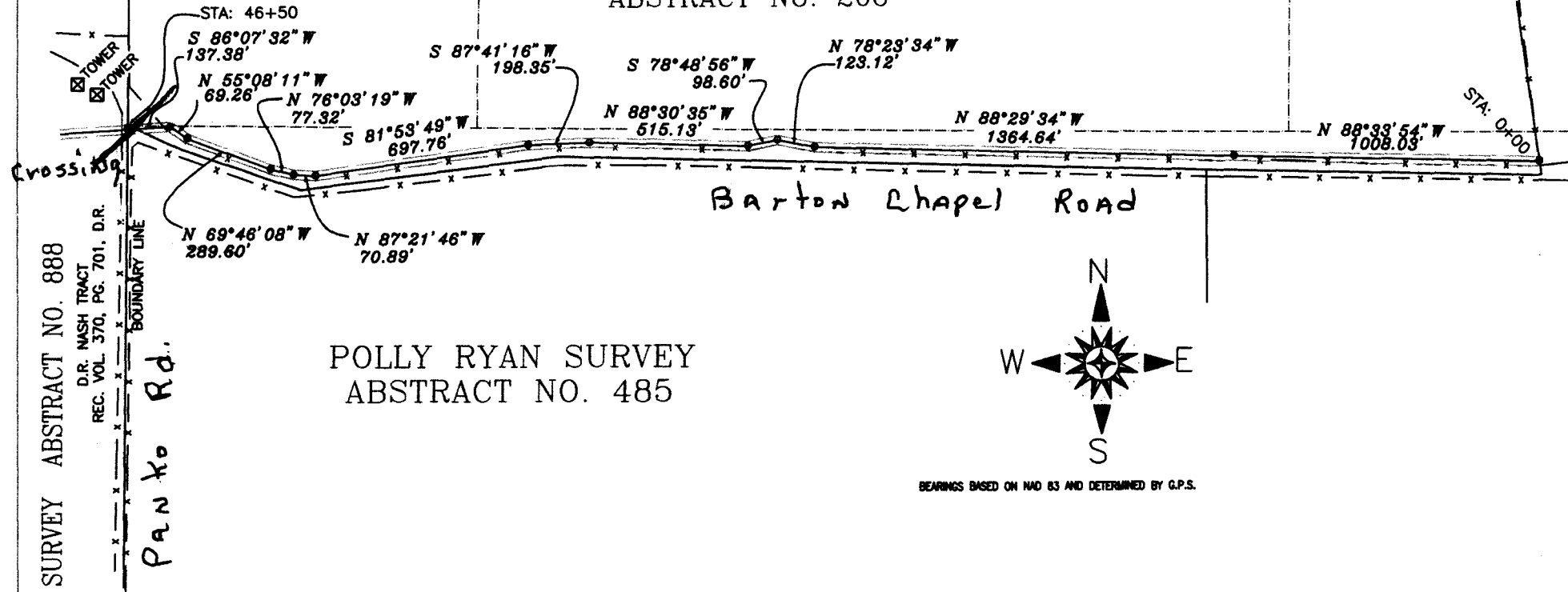
