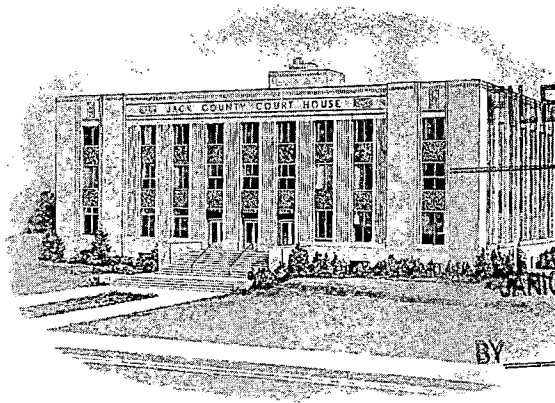

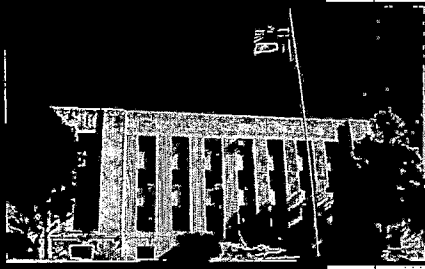

## TWON (Texas Well Owners Network) Testing in Jack County

**Relevance:** Throughout many areas of Jack County the availability of quality groundwater supplies are at best limited. The county-wide testing program allows well owners to insure that their drinking water is safe for consumption.

**Response:** 77 Jack County Residents brought samples from their wells to be

screened for *bacteria, fecal coliform, nitrates, & salinity*. 16 wells tested positive for *bacteria & fecal coliform*.

Education program on water quality and rectification of issues was conducted by John Smith of TWON.

Five Perrin High School chemistry students assisted with the testing procedures and they received hands-on lab experience.

The Leadership Advisory Board (LAB) attended a training on the relevance of the TWON program and the importance of quality ground water testing.

**RELEVANCE:** Regular screenings significantly increases the likelihood of finding cancer early, when treatment is more often successful. Mortality is higher for rural women because of later diagnosis

**RESPONSE:**

14 total volunteers assisted

at party/events.

Dr. Nicole Bartosh, MD, Edna Munoz, RN, and two survivor speakers urged women to obtain a mammogram/Pap screening at the events.

10 women requested help to navigate screening and diagnostic services. They were directed to the Moncrief Cancer Institute program so that their

mammograms could be done in Jacksboro through the mobile unit.

67 clinical sites are contracted statewide for screenings, diagnostics, radiologists and lab services. Average monthly payments for screenings and diagnostics thru the contracts is \$32,636.00.


