



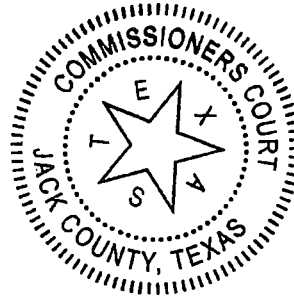

UPDATE ON CTIF GRANT AND FEMA FLOOD GRANT

Court members discussed among themselves and with the Auditor and Treasurer the status of completion, administration, and billing in the CTIF grant through TxDOT and FEMA Flood Grant (2015).

Sheriff Melvin Mayo and Judge Davenport brought to the Court's attention that there have been mass gatherings for different events in the County. Some of these events have the potential to bring in large amounts of people and to be properly prepared for these gatherings the County already has a Mass Gathering statute that may need some modification to properly prepare the County and the individuals putting on the event on for any emergencies that could arise.

Treasurer Kim Gibby advised the Court she has been working with the Justice of the Peace office to work out a plan for her to be able to balance with their office more efficiently. She made mention that the County will need to look into purchasing financial software for all of the departments to use.

Tax Assessor – Collector, Sharon Robinson spoke to the Court about the current procedure for bidding on tax sale property leaving the county open to individuals winning bids on property at the sale and having delinquent taxes on other property they already own in the county. She and Judge Davenport will work on coming up with a new procedure to ensure bidders are current before the sale takes place.

ADJOURNMENT





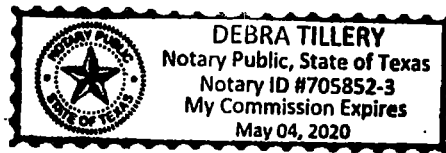

Four (4) – Speed Limit Signs removed by vandals on Cundiff Crafton Road. Located thrown from bridge. Traffic Cones swept away by high water.

5. Any bridges, culverts, or other improvements necessary to place the precinct roads in good condition, and the probable cost of the improvements: Evacuation Route for residences on Pudding Valley and Post Oak Road during high water flooding conditions is being evaluated - \$125,000

7. The primary cause of any degradation of our county roads, bridges, and culverts is due to heavy rainfall causing flood conditions and heavy use from oilfield service traffic.
