On this the 14<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2016 the Commissioners Court of Jack County, Texas met in Regular session at 10:06 a.m. with the following elected officials present:

ReDonna Pulis with the Jacksboro Chamber of Commerce addressed the Court regarding a revision the Chamber is seeking to the agreement between the Chamber of Commerce, City of Jacksboro and Jack County on the ability of churches that are members of the Chamber being able to pay to advertise on the marquee sign their office and service hours without putting any church doctrine on the advertisement. Judge Davenport informed her that the matter had been tabled, had not been requested by any member of the Court to be taken off of the table and that was their answer.

#### PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND CLAIMS

All accounts and claims were submitted to the Court for approval. Those submitted were approved and entered into the computer of the County Treasurer.

Judge Davenport made a motion to pay all the bills. Commissioner Brock seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

#### CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

The following items were taken up under the Consent Agenda:

Judge Davenport made a motion to approve the consent agenda items. Commissioner Brock seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

## TIMED AGENDA

Johnny Callan spoke to the Court about a tourism project he has planned and is looking for the County to help with funding the project which will be located at the Jacksboro Lake. His plan is to build a dock in an area of the lake where citizens and visitors can fish, picnic and swim. The projected cost of this project is approximately \$28,000. The City of Jacksboro will also help fund and he is talking with other local businesses.

Motion was made by Commissioner Umphress to support the project up to \$14,000. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Cozart. Motion carried unanimously.

## COMMISSIONER PRECINCT OPERATIONS

The Commissioner's discussed different projects they have currently and are preparing for in their precincts.

Commissioner Umphress has been approached by a landowner about redirecting the county road in an area that would benefit the county and the landowner. Judge Davenport advised him to contact the County Attorney for more information on what will need to be done.

### **UPDATE ON COURTHOUSE REPAIR PROJECT 2016**

Judge Davenport reported County Treasurer's office has been moved upstairs while Danny begins work in her office. The Assembly Room will be open and ready for the Thanksgiving gathering on Monday.

### UPDATE ON CTIF GRANT AND FEMA FLOOD

County Treasurer Kim Gibby reported she is sending in a request for status of FEMA grant.

Court members discussed among themselves and with the Auditor and Treasurer the status of completion, administration, and billing in the CTIF grant through TxDOT and FEMA Flood Grant (2015). Discussed how much is left on the CTIF reimbursement to date. Requested \$918,000 out of \$1.4 million, also discussed the status of FEMA reimbursement.

# REPORTS BY DEPARTMENT HEADS

Discussion was made to remind everyone about the Thanksgiving gathering on Monday the 21<sup>st</sup>. That same day the Commissioner's will need to meet for a short time to canvass votes for the General Election.

# COUNTY JUDGE REPORTS ON RESEARCH REGARDING PERMITS TO CONSTRUCT ACCESS DRIVEWAY FACILITIES

Report from County Judge on research regarding permits to construct driveway facilities;

Judge Davenport reported that he has been researching what processes other counties have in place. Palo Pinto County has no process in place, however, Parker County does. In those counties, the land owner buys the tin horn and the County installs it. The county determines the size and specifications of the needed tinhorn. After discussion it was decided that Judge Davenport will update the court later on further information received to determine if the Court determines if it wants to adopt a process. This will be put on the next agenda.

# CONSIDER REQUEST BY TAXPAYER FOR REFUND OF PAYMENT OF PENALTY AND/OR INTEREST ON DELINQUENT 2015 TAXES

A request was received from Sharon A. Hyde for a refund of the penalty and/or interest she paid on delinquent taxes. Judge Davenport reported that he has read the applicable statute concerning these refunds and forwarded a copy of the statute along with a memo on the issue to the Commissioners. He says that this case does not fit the criteria set out for a refund of penalty and/or interest.

Motion was made by Commissioner Umphress to deny the request as it does not meet the requirements for it. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Cozart and passed unanimously.

# DISCUSSION OF ACTION TO ADOPT AN ORDER ESTABLISHING PROPERTY SUBDIVISION REGISTRATION

Discussion was made in this matter over what the County might need to set as requirements for subdivisions. No action taken.
