PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND CLAIMS

All accounts and claims were submitted to the Court for approval. Those submitted were approved and entered into the computer of the County Treasurer.

Judge Davenport made a motion to pay all the bills. Commissioner Umphress seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

The following items were taken up under the Consent Agenda:

- (c) Reception of Certificates of Training hours for Elected/ Appointed County Official/Officer: Kim Gibby, County Treasurer;
- (d) Ratification of action previously approved regarding the substitution of securities pledged by County Depository;
- (e) Approval/Renewal of Performance Bond for Deputy Sheriff Adam Rydlinski;
- (f) Amendment of Budget FY17 to modify beginning balance of Fund 53 and Fund 90 to correct an error in posting;

Judge Davenport made a motion to adopt the consent agenda items. Commissioner Birdwell seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

CONSIDER PROPOSAL BY DENNIS BENNETT AND DOUG KIRKLEY OF PERFORMANCE SERVICES REGARDING A PROPOSED STUDY/ SURVEY IN ENERGY SAVING MEASURES IN THE OPERATION OF COUNTY BUILDINGS

Doug Kirkley of Performance Services provided information about the services offered to the County. The beginning of the process would be to talk with the Court about what they needs are in the County buildings. Then an engineer would come in and do a preliminary study on what they see could be updated to save energy cost for the County. Performance Services helps you find the needed updates and helps to get the updates made by using the funds already in the County's budget.

Motion made by Commissioner Umphress to move forward with the preliminary audit on all County owned buildings at no cost to the County. Motion was seconded by Judge Davenport and carried unanimously.

REVIEW/REVISION OF ROAD CROSSING PERMIT FORM

Judge Davenport reported that he has been working on a new permit form but does not have it ready to present to the Court today and made a motion to table this item until a later meeting. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Ward and passed unanimously.

DISCUSSION OF COMMISSIONER PRECINCT OPERATIONS

Commissioner Brock reported that the power plant off of Henderson Ranch Road has not been maintaining the paved road that they installed previously he has been receiving calls from residents about the state of the road. He has contacted the power plant they indicated they will

not be making repairs. Commissioner Brock will be removing the asphalt where it is needed and replacing with gravel.

Discussion was made over how far down Shepard's Trail and Southwind Road the County maintains.

Commissioner Umphress informed the Court that Precinct #1 assisted the City of Jacksboro out at Lake Jacksboro in the area of the baseball fields. They were able to move road material from an area that they will no longer use as a road to the roads surrounding the Jack County Fair Barn.

UPDATE ON COURTHOUSE REPAIR PROJECT 2017

No discussion made.

CTIF GRANT AND FEMA FLOOD GRANT

Court members discussed among themselves and with the Auditor and Treasurer the status of completion, administration, and billing in the CTIF grant through TxDOT and FEMA Flood Grant (2015). Discussed how much is left on the CTIF reimbursement to date. Requested \$918,000 out of \$1.4 million, also discussed the status of FEMA reimbursement.

REPORTS FROM DEPARTMENT HEADS

Judge Davenport provided information to the Commissioner's regarding abatements in the County and how much time each agreement has until its conclusion.

Vanessa James, County Clerk informed the Court that the Miscellaneous record books have been taken to be scanned and indexed. She was informed by Data Preservation Solutions that 4 of the 71 books do not open and would have to be taken apart and bound back together which will add some cost to the original quote.

REVIEW STATUS OF BUDGET FY17

Judge Davenport E-mailed budget summary analysis to the Commissioners that covers all departments for their review.

ADOPTION OF AN EMPLOYEE HAZARD COMMUNICATION PLAN FOR ALL COUNTY EMPLOYEES

Judge Davenport made motion to table this matter until a future meeting. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Umphress, Commissioners Umphress, Birdwell, Ward and Judge Davenport voted in favor. Commissioner Brock was not present for this vote.

CONSIDER AMENDMENT TO BUDGET FY17 APPOINTING AN EXISTING DEPUTY SHERIFF AS PATROL SARGEANT AND MOVING \$3,350 FROM EXISTING LINE ITEMS TO THAT DEPUTY'S SALARY

Chief Deputy Hardy spoke to the Court explaining how this change will be beneficial to the Sheriff's Department.

Commissioner Umphress made motion to move forward with this position and move the amount of \$3,350 from an unused line item over to pay the increase in salary. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Birdwell and it passed unanimously.



NOW COMES – TARGA MIDSTREAM SERVICES LLC, hereinafter called Company, and respectfully makes this application to the Commissioners Court of Jack County, Texas, to grant unto the Company authorization to lay a pipeline or place a utility across and under the public roads of the County of Jack, State of Texas, conditioned as follows:

1. That said Company, in consideration for the grant by said County, does hereby agree that said pipeline/utility of the following description, crossing a county road in Precinct - 1 (one), Jack County, Texas, at a point hereinafter indicated, will be constructed in such a manner that the construction of same will not interfere with public travel, and that no construction will begin until the Commissioner of said precinct, his agents, or employee approves said location by an on-site inspection.

DESCRIPTION AND LOCATION (Map must be attached. Aerial photos are not acceptable. Location should include GPS coordinates of crossing.):

Targa proposes to install a four (4) inch poly line to be incased inside a six (6) steel line beneath Truce Road by directional bore method six (6) feet below the bar ditches. Marker signs will be placed on each side of the road right of way in a clear and visible manner. (East Truce Rd.)

LAT: 33°24'42.24" ; LONG: 98°01'38.36"

2. The Company assures the County that it has obtained authorization, if any is required, from any landowners adjoining the crossing to cross whatever portion of their land, if any, lies beneath the roadway.
3. Such pipeline/utility shall be so buried, covered, constructed and maintained as not to interfere with the use and occupancy of such roads by the public or the County. That a pipeline shall be buried to the depth of at least six (6) feet below the surface of the borrow ditch, that the pipeline/utility shall be situated no closer than three (3) feet from the edge of the roadway, and that the road will be restored at the time of construction to its original condition.
4. In the event it becomes necessary to build a Farm-to-Market Road or other road across such roads, it will become the duty of said the Company to adjust its pipeline with such construction without compensation from the County.
5. If said crossing is accomplished by crossing the traveled portion of said road, then the Company agrees it shall, that at its expense, bore under the road as its means of crossing and not cut or trench said road for a crossing. Said boring shall be at a depth of at least six (6) feet below the depth of the borrow ditch.

6. The Company shall fill and level ditches using appropriate fill material or gravel so as to return the road and/or borrow ditch in same condition as before construction so far as possible. Company shall remove any large rocks unearthed at construction at its expense.

7. The Company shall pay, at the time of application, the sum of \$500.00 for each crossing unto the Treasurer of Jack County, Texas. In the event that the permit is not granted, the application fee will be returned.

8. Said access herein granted may be assigned by the Company without further grant or procedure but grantee shall be bound by the same conditions.

9. In the event that the Company abandons its line, the Company shall remove its line from the roadway and this grant is vacated.

10. The Company is responsible to present this application to the Commissioner of the Precinct involved and obtain his signature evidencing the fact that he has seen the application and discussed the location with the Company. The Company shall then present the Application with the appropriate check to the County Judge's Office to then make arrangements for placing the matter on the Commissioners Court Agenda for approval.

11. The Company shall call the County Commissioner 48 hours prior to starting the actual work.
