PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND CLAIMS

All accounts and claims were submitted to the Court for approval. Those submitted were approved and entered into the computer of the County Treasurer.

Judge Davenport made a motion to pay all the bills. Commissioner Umphress seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

The following items were taken up under the Consent Agenda:

- (a) Approval of Minutes of July 10, 2017;
- (b) Review and Acceptance of Treasurer's and Auditor's Monthly Reports for period ending June 30, 2017;

Judge Davenport made a motion to adopt the consent agenda items. Commissioner Birdwell seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

TIMED AGENDA ITEMS

10:00 a.m. - Public hearing on proposed revision in County Voting Plan to allow countywide voting in the November 7, 2017 Election pending approval by the Texas Secretary of State was held.

Mike Smith along with members of the committee met last Tuesday and discussed countywide voting and are requesting that the Commissioners apply for county-wide elections. Mr. Smith announced that all committee members agreed that countywide would be very beneficial to the voters of Jack County. This application will only be good for the November 7, 2017 election.

DISCUSSION OF PRECINCT OPERATIONS

Discussion was made by Commissioners over projects in their precincts and information they have to share with the Court. Commissioner Birdwell reported he will move the packer currently located in Precinct 3 to Precinct 4. Commissioner Brock reported there has been vandalism at the Precinct 2 barn, including a broken vehicle window. Commissioners discussed posting NO TRESPASSING signs and possibly adding video surveillance in the future.

UPDATE ON COURTHOUSE REPAIR PROJECT 2017

Danny Nash recently finished the Judge's office and they have moved back in. The next project will be the Tax Office.

CTIF GRANT AND FEMA FLOOD GRANT

Kim Gibby was unavailable but left information for Commissioners to review. FEMA inspection will be soon.

REPORTS FROM DEPARTMENT HEADS

County Clerk Vanessa James will be meeting with HART during the upcoming election conference to schedule acceptance testing and training for the new Verity equipment.

Constable Clyde Watson gave an update on a new program purchased to help find people that owe money or have warrants.

Discussion was made that the kitchen in the assembly room may need to be blocked off when the tax office moves in during the remodel of their office.

Judge Davenport reported that he would like to move a panic button into the parole office at the LEC. Mike Hardy reported that no commission has been received in more than a year for the inmate phone system. He also reported they should have information on the roof repairs soon, and that the jail count is at 20 now with 1 trustee.

DISCUSSION OF POSSIBLE AUCTION OF COUNTY SURPLUS PROPERTY

Commissioner Brock reported that he has several trucks to be auctioned and thought there would possibly be a few from the Sheriff's Department. He will be checking VIN numbers and preparing for the sale.

DISCUSSION OF MEASURES IN THE SALE OF ALL DELINQUENT PROPERTIES HELD BY THE COUNTY AS TRUSTEE FOR THE OTHER ENTITIES IN THE COUNTY

Judge Davenport reported there are only 3 or 4 delinquent properties at this time and there has been a lot of interest. He suggested figuring up a minimum bid for each property which would include taxes owed at sale, clean up fees owed the City, advertising, and any auctioneer fees associated with each property when putting them up for bid.

Commissioner Brock made a motion to set a minimum bid as stated above. Commissioner Umphress seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

REVIEW/UPDATE OF PENDING LEASE/PURCHASE ON FORD EXPLORERS (4) FOR SHERIFF'S OFFICE-DEPUTY MIKE HARDY

Deputy Mike Hardy gave an update on the lease of Ford Explorers with updated costs. They would need Judge Davenport's signature on the paperwork to get the lease process started.

Commissioner Umphress made a motion to move forward with the lease agreement. Commissioner Ward seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

REVIEW PROPOSALS BY MID-CONTINENTAL RESTORATION COMPANY REGARDING THE COURTHOUSE EXTERIOR

Judge Davenport has received a proposal on treating the exterior of the courthouse, but several issues arose regarding more information. Commissioners discussed whether there was enough grant money remaining to complete this project.

Commissioner Brock made a motion to table item at this time until further information is provided. Commissioner Birdwell seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

REVIEW AND AMEND THE COUNTY CLERK'S FY17 BUDGET TO PROVIDE FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE NEW HART EQUIPMENT-(\$109,874.00)

County Auditor Lisa Perry explained the breakdown of line items and changes in the General Fund.

Commission Umphress made a motion to make the correct line item changes to the budget. Commissioner Ward seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

There being no further business motion was made by Commissioner Brock to adjourn. Judge Davenport seconded the motion to adjourn. The motion carried unanimously.


