PUBLIC HEARING ON 2018 COUNTY WIDE VOTING AND SEEKING A PERMANENT CHANGE IN JACK COUNTY VOTING PLAN CONSISTENT WITH THE TEMPORARY CHANGES IN THE VOTING PLAN FOR THE NOVEMBER 8, 2017 ELECTION

Public hearing began at 10:05 a.m. with City Manager Mike Smith telling Commissioners that he received no negative feedback and recommends we continue using the County-wide plan.

Previous Republican chair, Sharon Van Baale said she hopes more people will get out and vote now knowing they can go to any voting location. She really likes this plan for voters. The only concern was if the voting machines could be hacked. County Clerk Vanessa James clarified that the actual voting machines are never connected to the internet therefore they cannot be compromised.

Judy McRoberts has been a pollworker for 25 years and reports that she likes the County-wide voting plan and received nothing but positive feedback from voters. She recommends keeping this plan.

Commissioner Ward made a motion to make County Wide voting permanent in Jack County. Commissioner Berry seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF JOINT PRIMARY ELECTION SERVICES CONTRACT BETWEEN THE COUNTY AND THE JACK COUNTY DEMOCRATIC PARTY AND THE JACK COUNTY REPUBLICAN PARTY

Judge Davenport made a motion to approve the joint election services contract between the County and the Jack County Democratic Party and the Jack County Republican Party. Commissioner Berry seconded and the motion passed unanimously.


