#### UPDATE ON DISCUSSION OF ADOPTED COUNTY ROAD MAP WITH LEGAL COUNSEL OF ALLISON, BASS & ASSOCIATES-JUDGE UMPHRESS

Several members of the public were present to address concerns with the County Road map. Jarrod Stephens owner of Brazos Title Company, Zack Zeitler and Clinton Farris with Double Z Surveying along with Bob & Roxanna Maddox with Maddox Realty all voiced their concerns with discrepancies in the County Road map which was adopted in 2006. The discrepancies have caused issues with title policies concerning ingress and egress along with other issues. Judge Umphress told the individuals that he realizes there are discrepancies but the County Road book is the standard since it was adopted by Commissioner's Court and is filed in Austin, however he has an open door policy and looks forward to discussing matters on a case by case basis with anyone having issues to find a resolution. This will be an ongoing process. No action was taken at this time.

Judge Umphress made a motion to table the item at this time. Commissioner Oliver seconded and the motion carried (4-0).

REPORT OF TIDC (TEXAS INDIGENT DEFENSE COMMISSION) OF FY19 FORMULA STATEMENT OF GRANT AWARD TO THE COUNTY OF JACK IN THE AMOUNT OF \$12,024-JUDGE UMPHRESS

Judge Umphress discussed the ever increasing cost of court-appointed attorneys in Jack County which is coming out of local funds. CPS and family court is the biggest expense to the county. The county understands the cost balance between approving a court-appointed attorney and the individual remaining in jail. There was a discussion but no action was taken

PRESENTATION BY LINEBARGER, GOGGAN, BLAIR & SAMPSON, LLP TO DISCUSS AND ACCEPT OFFER FOR STRUCK OFF PROPERTY LOCATED AT 339 NORTH  $9^{TH}$ STREET, JACKSBORO, TEXAS, MORE FULLY DESCRIBED IN SUITE #4485-B

Barbara Williams and Sandy Gilbert provided information to the Commissioners on the Tax Calendar, explaining that tax statements are sent out in October, if not paid by January, penalty, and interest begin. After explaining the tax calendar, they discussed the property at 339 North 9th street. A bid was presented for this property in the amount of \$17,200 which must be approved by all of the taxing entities before final acceptance. The amount is less than what is owed but this would get the property back on the tax rolls. They also have a list of properties struck off to the county. These will be put up for auction at a later date.

Commissioner Oliver made a motion to accept the bid of \$17,200. Commissioner Ward seconded and the motion passed (3-0). Commissioner Brock was absent for the vote.

# DISCUSS AND UPDATE THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE OUTSTANDING COLLECTION ACTIVITIES WITH LINEBARGER, GOGGAN, BLAIR & SAMPSON, LLP

Commissioners discussed the conflict between Linebarger and NetData. The Justice of the Peace has over \$500,000 in uncollected fees and there have been no collections from Linebarger since 2016. Judge Umphress and Judge Spurlock met with Corey Fickes, with Linebarger and agreed to give them until November which will be time for contract renewal, to process collections and collect at least \$100,000 before turning it over to NetData. There will be a \$4,800 charge from NetData to allow Linebarger access to the Justice of the Peace Records. The access fee will be paid by Linebarger.

Commissioner Ward made a motion to give Linebarger until November to collect at least \$100,000 of uncollected fees and then review. Commissioner Oliver seconded and the motion passed (4-0).

# UPDATE OF COMMUNICATION WITH ALLISON, BASS & MAGEE, ATTORNEYS REGARDING THE COUNTY LANDFILL-JUDGE UMPHRESS

Judge Umphress spoke with Eric Magee who informed him the process could be streamlined. The County will not have to have any public hearings, just have them draw up the paperwork and present to Commissioner's Court. Judge Umphress will be getting back with Allison, Bass, and Magee to move forward with the process.

Judge Umphress made a motion to table the item until more information is received from Allison, Bass & Magee. Commissioner Brock seconded and the motion passed (4-0).

# DISCUSS AND APPROVE UTILIZATION/INSTALLATION OF COUNTY-OWNED GENERATOR FROM RADIO TOWER TO COURTHOUSE, FOR THE PURPOSE TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY ELECTRICAL BACKUP POWER

Emergency Management Coordinator Frank Hefner addressed the Commissioners concerning a County owned generator in Precinct #1 off of Highway 148 stored at the radio tower. The generator has not been used for some time and he feels it would be a wise move to bring it to the courthouse. The Courthouse generator is only 10K and has been here for about 30 years. They are beginning to have many issues with the old one, and he feels this would serve the Courthouse in a greater capacity as it is a 42K generator. There would be a cost to have it moved but that would come from Courthouse security funds.

Commissioner Brock made a motion to table the item until they are able to get a bid from Miller Electric on moving the generator. Commissioner Oliver seconded and the motion passed (4-0).

# DISCUSS AND RECOMMEND BUDGET PLANNING/WORKSHOP CALENDER FOR the FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020

Judge Umphress spoke to Commissioners about beginning the budget process in April this year. He would like to begin meeting with Department heads to give guidance and direction on spending. In May, Auditor, Judge, Commissioner and Department Head would work together to compile the individual department's estimated expenses. The Proposed Budget would be filed in July. He would like input from Commissioners on County employee pay increases for this next budget cycle as well. Beginning the budget process earlier should decrease the number of budget workshops thus making the process run more efficiently. Judge Umphress also told Commissioners that Jack County is healthy financially but he feels we should always be good stewards of the County's finances.

No action was taken.

## DISCUSSION OF COMMISSIONER PRECINCT OPERATIONS

Commissioner Brock reported that Perrin is still having water issues. Rep. Drew Springer's Office has scheduled a combined meeting with TCEQ and PUC. All are working towards a

solution. Commissioner Brock recently utilized and distributed pallets of water from the Jack County Strategic Reserves, for the Perrin Community to have drinking water.

#### **DEPARTMENT HEADS**

Judge Umphress told Commissioners he has been very pleased with Constable Clyde Watson and Emergency Management Coordinator Frank Hefner. Their efforts in creating a safe work environment at the Courthouse and for the Community have been outstanding. Constable Watson set up security training for all Courthouse employees and Frank Hefner has been working diligently with Nortex for Homeland Security grants. Having these gentlemen with the County is an asset and brings value to Jack County.

Deputy David VanderKaay introduced the newest Deputy, Parker Walden to Commissioners. Parker is a lifelong resident of Jack County and is eager to serve the County he grew up in.

Maintenance Supervisor Lane Argo reported to Commissioners that the plumbers will be here soon to finish the restrooms on the North end of the Courthouse. They were on hold due to a recent trial in District Court in which all restrooms were needed to be operative.

The 30.06 and 30.07 lettering has been removed from the courthouse exterior doors. Lane is also pricing new exterior doors which will be more effective with our Courthouse Security updates.

Matthew with Otis Elevators will be at the next Commissioner Court meeting to speak with Commissioners on repairs to the elevator and costs.

Lane has been helping with some repairs and maintenance at the LEC. He told Commissioners Roof Pro will be replacing some roof flashing that blew off in the recent storm. He also reported more issues with the drain line in the kitchen. He had Mr. Rooter come out and do some work. They would like to run a jet cleaner through the system which they feel would correct the issues that have been ongoing. He also reported that Sheriff Spurlock has allowed him to implement a Celebrate Recovery program at the LEC which he feels will help build morale and greatly influence the inmates in a positive manner.

Judge Umphress said he would like to speak with the Warden at the John R. Lindsey state prison to see if inmates on work detail could assist with upkeep on mowing at the LEC.

There being no further business motion was made by Commissioner Brock to adjourn. Commissioner Oliver seconded the motion to adjourn and the motion passed unanimously (4-0).


