ANNUAL [REPORT](#) BY JACK COUNTY CHILD WELFARE BOARD OATH OF OFFICES

Bill Dehart Secretary/Treasurer of the Jack County Child Welfare board gave an overview and update on what is happening with the local Child Welfare. Jack County Child Welfare helps low income families in the county with occasional bills, food or necessities and provided Christmas gifts for 8 local families. There are currently \$23,000 in available funds. They have provided pamphlets to local law enforcement to be responsive in assisting in any way possible. He recognized the local board members who were in attendance Missy Coufal, Terry Stretcher, Cameron Garza and Sharon Robinson. Members not in attendance are Linda Wade, Claudia Torres and Kathy McAnear.

Judge Umphress swore in the Jack County Child Welfare board members.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING NEXTREQUEST PUBLIC INFORMATION TRACKING SOFTWARE

Judge Umphress and Frank Hefner gave an overview of the system and how it would be beneficial to the County. The system would start the clock on the 10 day public information request time line and would add a time stamp once the request is completed to assist in the audit process.

Commissioner Ward made a motion to approve the NEXTREQUEST Public Information Tracking [software](#) and pay for it out of the IT budget and if it goes over take out of reserves. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Salazar and passed (5-0).

DISCUSS AND APPROVE THE RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING AND NAMING A PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICER

Commissioner Birdwell made a motion to approve the [Resolution](#) and give authority to the County Judge to appoint the public information officer. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Ward and passed (5-0).

AUTHORIZE THE PUBLICATION AND POSTING ON THE JACK COUNTY WEBSITE OF THE TEXAS PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT NOTICE

Motion was made by Commissioner Birdwell to authorize the publication and posting of the Texas Public Information Act Notice on the Jack County website. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Salazar and passed (5-0).

DISCUSS DISTRICT COURTROOM RENOVATIONS AND APPROVAL OF EXPENSES

Update Audio/video system.

Motion was made by Commissioner Oliver to approve the funds for the audio/video system and installation. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Birdwell and passed (5-0).

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING COURTHOUSE AND SHERIFF'S OFFICE HOLIDAYS AND INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

Sheriff Hauger presented a proposal to the Court for review and consideration regarding holidays and inclement weather policy for the Sheriff's Office.
